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SAF 2026 Briefing SFS & BPS

The details below provide an initial guide for some of the key components of the SAF in 2026. With both the SFS and the BPS Scheme operational this year, commentary on the subject areas is split.

The left-hand column (in blue) refers to the new SFS scheme and the detail on the right-hand column (in red) will refer to the BPS.

Where actions for the headline entry are identical for both SFS and BPS, the columns will be merged and highlighted in green.

4.	Habitat Payments for Common Land	
	<p>The Welsh Government has agreed to extensions for the Habitat Wales Scheme Commons contracts for 2026, targeting land that previously held Glastir Commons and subsequently 2024/2025 Habitat Wales contracts.</p> <p>Eligible grazing associations should have received and accepted contract extension offers via their RPW Online account ahead of the SAF period.</p> <p>Claims must be made for the Funding on the Commons Claim Form by the 15 May 2026. Claims received after this date will be subject to a late submission penalty. No claims will be accepted after 10 June 2026.</p>	
5.	One Login	
	<p>Some RPW Online account holders will have transitioned from Government Gateway to One Login. For the SAF period RPW are continuing to offer access via One Login or Government Gateway. It is expected that Government Gateway will cease to be available from the end of June 2026 and all users will need to transition to One Login.</p> <p>One Login will also be the access route to Farming Connect Services under the new programme, and farmers are encouraged to re-register with Farming Connect and set up their One Login access.</p> <p>For some Universal Actions (UA) such as benchmarking and CPD, limited information about the UAs can pass from one organisation to the other, minimising the need to report on the UAs achieved during the scheme year.</p> <p>To aid with transitioning to One Login, Farming Connect are offering ICT training sessions for farmers to upskill.</p> <p>Farmers will need to have access to an individual e-mail account and mobile phone to utilise One Login.</p>

7.	SAF 2026 Deadline	
	<p>The Welsh Government must receive your completed SAF no later than midnight on Friday, 15 May 2026. Applications received from 16 May 2026 up to and including 9 June 2026 will incur financial penalties. Applications and claims received after 9 June 2026 cannot be accepted.</p>	
8.	Transfer of Entitlements	

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	<p>There is no Entitlement provision within the SFS.</p>	<p>BPS entitlements can continue to be transferred or leased provided the number of entitlements transferred or leased occurs with the equivalent (or more) area of eligible BPS land.</p> <p>Transfer or lease of BPS entitlements without land will no longer be permitted. Where entitlements are leased the end date for both the entitlements and the accompanying land must match.</p> <p>If the lease of land ends early, the entitlements will return to the lessor.</p> <p>Where the lessor is claiming SFS, those entitlements will automatically be surrendered.</p> <p>Transfer and lease of BPS entitlements with land can continue for the duration of the transition period, whilst BPS is available up to the 2028 scheme year.</p> <p>Closure of Transfer & Lease of BPS Entitlements for the scheme year will be 15th May 2026.</p>

	<p>There is no Entitlement provision within the SFS.</p>	<p>From the 1 January 2026 the 2-year usage rule will end for BPS entitlements and the clawback of BPS entitlements process will stop.</p> <p>From 1 January 2026, once a farm business claims SFS, they will no longer have the option of claiming BPS. Any BPS entitlements held by the farm business will be 'surrendered' i.e. no longer available to activate via a BPS claim or for trading on the open market.</p>

21.	Habitat Baseline Review (HBR)	
	<p>The Habitat Baseline Review needs to be completed within the SFS SAF form. 	When a SAF is submitted you will receive an instant online receipt which it is recommended you print or screenshot for your records – if you don't receive this receipt, message RPW via the members online account or ring the Customer Contact Centre.
